The Society's oral history project is winding down to completion. Suellen Cheng and Debbie Hansen have been working on the indexing and summarizing phases. June Mei has completed the English translation of the pure Chinese interview tapes which were transcribed in China. Thanks to new space-age technologies available through the efforts of Gerald Shue and Munson Kwok, and the assistance of Xenobus Company, the technically complex aspects of the indexing tasks are being accomplished with the use of a word processor and data base management.
