#### WHO'S IN THE NEWS

CHSSC is proud to have as a member Miriam Matthews, who was featured in the March 2 VIEW section of the Los Angeles Times. Miriam is California's first Black librarian and chronicler of Black history. Through the years, she has generated a great deal of interest in Negro History Week. She will be publishing a pictorial history of the Blacks in California from 1781 to 1910.

The Society extends its best wishes for a speedy and complete recovery to Francis Waddingham, Sr., who is now at home recuperating from a recent heart attack. The Waddinghams are two very loyal and devoted members of CHSSC.

At the Society's Feb. 2 meeting, a program scheduled by the Association for Asian Pacific American Artists (AAPAA) was cancelled, due to last-minute engagements elsewhere for two members of the cast. Fortunately, Program Chairperson Emma Louie was able to contact Mr. Jiahn-min Huang, who graciously consented to fill in as guest speaker for the evening. Mr. Huang, a Society member, is a native of Taiwan, and has done extensive research on the history of Chinese architecture. His presentation and slide-show explained the traditions of Chinese buildings — the styles of roofs, the significance of various symbols and decorations, and the principles and philosophy as reflected in the buildings in Los Angeles Chinatown. Mr. Huang received his Master's Degree in Architecture from UCLA. His thesis included a study of buildings in Los Angeles Chinatown as compared with traditional Chinese buildings. A copy of the thesis was given to the Society for its archives.

There was a good turnout for the Spring Dinner meeting on Saturday, March 5, at the Grandview Gardens. CHSSC member Roberta Greenwood was the featured speaker. Her presentation and slide-show gave the audience an excellent first-hand view of the role played by the Chinese in the city of Ventura. The Society extends its thanks to Mrs. Greenwood for a most entertaining evening.
