On a recent trip to San Francisco to visit family members and childhood friends, time passed by so quickly that there were a number of things that I was not able to do -- I did not get a ride on those "little cable cars that go halfway to the stars"; I did not get to Fisherman's Wharf for that wonderful sourdough bread; I did not have a chance to climb my favorite hill for that spectacular view of the San Francisco bay. However, I did accomplish one of my "Things to do in S. F.", and that was a visit with CHSSC member and author Ruthanne Lum McCunn. Ruthanne and her husband Don live in a charming blue-and-yellow Victorian house which has been lovingly and beautifully renovated by Mr. McCunn.

Prior to this visit, Ruthanne and I had communicated only by telephone or U.S. mail, and it was a great delight to finally meet the McCunns. After a delicious luncheon prepared by Ruthanne, we settled down comfortably in her sunny Victorian "parlour" and enjoyed a most pleasant two hours of conversation on various subjects, one of which concerned Ruthanne's books -- THOUSAND PIECES OF GOLD, AN ILLUSTRATED HISTORY OF THE CHINESE IN AMERICA, and PIE-BITER.

Last fall, as many CHSSC members will remember, Ruthanne made a generous offer of a 50% discount on her books to Society members. Over 120 books were ordered -- autographed by the author, expertly packed by her husband Don, and mailed in sufficient time for Christmas-gifting. Ruthanne now has a fourth book almost ready for the publisher's -- \underline{SOLE} $\underline{SURVIVOR}$, a story about Lim Poon, lone survivor of a British ship that was torpedoed by an enemy submarine off the African coast during World War II.

In September 1978, through arrangements made by John Yee, five CHSSC members interviewed Mr. Poon when his ship docked in Long Beach. An issue of the GUM SAAN JOURNAL (Vol. II, No. 2) was dedicated to this courageous man, who holds the world's record of the longest survival alone on a raft -- 133 days, or almost 4½ months. After reading the story of Lim Poon, Ruthanne decided to write her book, which received excellent notices at the recent Booksellers' Convention in San Francisco, and was selected as an alternate "Book of the Month" by the Dolphin Book Club.

CHSSC hopes to have both Lim Poon and Ruthanne at one of its upcoming meetings, thus giving the Society the opportunity to honor these two outstanding people -- Ruthanne, for her fine books on Chinese American history; and Lim Poon, for his courage and determination to survive his harrowing ordeal. This honor for Mr. Poon is one that is long overdue -- 42 years, to be exact!

DONATIONS

Members Howard and Marilyn Quon, and Howard's brothers have donated \$1000 to the Society's El Pueblo Chinese American Museum Fund in honor of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Foon Hep (Poy) Quon. The family was raised in the Garnier Building, site of the coming new museum and Poy Quon was one of the noted community leaders of his time. The 10K Run Committee has given the Society \$300 to help conduct its community projects for this year.

CHINA SOCIETY 50TH ANNIVERSARY

Over 80 members of the Chinese Historical Society joined China Society members and friends to celebrate this unique Chinatown institution's fiftieth anniversary, on June 9 at Man Jen Low. Participating on a panel discussing the Chinese in America and in Los Angeles Chinatown were members Ruby Ling Louie and Munson Kwok. Member Beulah Quo was MC for the panel. Following the banquet, Dr. Theodore Chen served as keynoter for the occasion. He discussed the future for Chinese Americans and for the China Society. Kwok presented a Chinese Historical Society of Southern California Board Resolution to the China Society of Southern California commemorating the anniversary. These nicely framed documents are beautifully hand made by George Yee and Glenn Yee. Previous organizational recepients include the C.A.C.A. Los Angeles Lodge at 70, Castelar School at 100, and the Mei Wah Club at 50. The China Society president is Robert Lee, one of our constant supporters through the years.

FIDDLETOWN STORE

As previously announced, the Fiddletown Preservation Society has received \$80,000 on a matching arrangement to save the rammed earth adobe structure and museum, the Chew Kee Store. To get the full amount, community donations of \$8000 must be gathered. So far, \$4500 has been collected.

By now, members should be familiar with the Chew Kee Store, a structure and interior literally frozen in time, the legacy of a Chinese pioneer of the Mother Lode. This effort was one of our Society's earliest battles and projects, and we have made two field trips to the store, once in our first year of operation, and once again on our memorable Mother Lode bus trip last year.

"THE CHINESE IN CALIFORNIA: A PHOTOGRAPHIC SEARCH"

As a step in building up our historical collection (with an eye towards the El Pueblo Chinese American Museum), we will be holding the first of what we hope will be a regular event. A photo search. We are interested in photographs that you, your family, and friends might have depicting the Chinese in California. With an emphasis on Southern California and especially Los Angeles. The photographs should fall into the time period from about 1850 through the mid-1960's.

Examples of the type of photographs we are looking for include:

1. China City; Old Chinatown

2. New Chinatown in the early years

 Chinese at work: on farms, in shops, during WWII, in the Produce Market area, in "nontraditional" jobs

4. Chinese at home: family, living quarters, neighborhoods, schools, upholding traditional values and rituals, recreational activities

5. Organizations: Chinese groups(cultural, professional, community), events held by the groups, parades, awards

If in doubt, bring the photographs anyway. No matter what condition. Black and white photographs; color photographs; wrinkled condition; yellowed and faded photographs; pasted in a photo album; large and small sizes; mounted in frames. Negatives of the photographs, if possible. Slides also.

We will be selecting photographs that are brought in for copying for our collection. However, if anyone is willing to donate their photographs to the Society, that would be very much appreciated. We will also be trying to find out the particulars of the items brought in. Such as who are the people, year the picture was taken, where it was taken, and the occasion or event.

So, look around the house. The pictures on the walls. In family albums. In storage boxes. In drawers. Tell your friends and neighbors. We need to see photos. Bring them to:


