AUTHOR!! AUTHOR!!

The Society's May 1 meeting -- what an exciting event! Following a brief business meeting, an excellent slide show was presented by Judy Chu, with photos from the Southern California Chinese American Oral History Project. Then came the grand presentation of the Society's first published book, "Linking Our Lives", lovingly dedicated to Helen Young, a founding member of CHSSC, a dedicated and selfless community volunteer whose inspiration and devotion touched countless lives in and out of the Chinatown area.

"Linking Our Lives" is a fascinating history of Chinese American women in Los Angeles, with much of its material gleaned from oral interviews with those women who played very vital roles in raising their families, in preserving the traditions of the mother country, and in building the community. The book was co-authored by eight young women of today: Lucie Cheng, Suellen Cheng, Judy Chu, Feelie Lee, Marjorie Lee, Susie Ling, Elaine Lou and Sucheta Mazumdar. Six of the authors were present at the meeting, and very graciously autographed copies of the book. A number of the interviewees were surprised, but delighted, to be asked for their autographs, also. Persons who appeared in some of the photographs happily signed their names. Even those whose names appeared somewhere in the book were requested to sign their "John Henry's"!. It was such fun to watch everyone scurrying around, with pen in hand, looking for prospective autographs! What made the event most significant, of course, was the fact that "Linking Our Lives" is the Society's first published venture, a book that has received many favorable comments, and deservedly so.

The evening was successful not only culturally, but also gastronomically. The "frosting on the cake", both literally and figuratively, were the delicious home-baked cakes, cookies and vast array of "goodies" on hand, a definite challenge to those on well-intentioned diets!

June 17, Monday - "Paper Angels", a play written by Genny Lim of San Francisco, will be televised on KCET's Channel 28 at 9 P.M. The play has been produced in theatres in San Francisco, Seattle and New York. Ms. Lim wrote the script for the television adaptation. During the early years of this century, as a result of the Chinese Exclusion Acts, immigrants from China were detained near San Francisco at Angel Island, the West Coast equivalent of Ellis Island. "Paper Angels" tells the story of the experiences of a group of Chinese immigrants to America. The author is the offspring of two generations of Angel Island immigrants. Cast members include such notable actors as Rosalind Chao, James Hong, and the Society's own Beulah Quo.

WALTER U. LUM PLACE will become a reality in San Francisco after months of active discussion. A measure has passed the Board of Supervisors and is due to be signed by Mayor Diane Feinstein. The street is located on the west side of Portsmouth Square, between Clay and Washington Streets. This will mark the first honor of this type for a Chinese American pioneer in a major city. Daughter Mabel Lum Lew and granddaughter Jocelyn Lew-Figueroa are Society members. Another member, Howard Quon, president of Chinese American Citizens Alliance, Los Angeles Lodge, worked very hard to get this measure passed.
