THE CHINESE IN ORANGE COUNTY

Orange County will hold its centennial celebration in the summer of '87. To bring historical significance to this event, an oral history project is being sponsored by Cal State Fullerton and the Chinese Historical and Cultural Foundation of Orange County. Lucinda Wong will be undertaking this project. She is requesting information on any current and former long-term Chinese residents of Orange County who would be willing to be interviewed regarding the Chinese experience and life styles in that area from the pre-World War II years to the present. Anyone working in agriculture or living in Chinatowns of Orange County would be of particular interest, but information from anyone else would also be of great value. Ms. Wong will be the interviewer, editor, and coordinator of this significant undertaking. When completed, the histories will be bound and placed in the Cal State Fullerton library, and will be available to whomever is interested in this special subject.
