

CONDOLENCES to the family of George W. Tom. George was one of the first Asian American hired by the Department of Water and Power where he was a proficient engineer for 45 plus years. During World War II, he served in the China-Burma-India Theater in the 14th Air Force under Gen. Claire Chennault, 14th Air Service Group, 555th Air Service Squadron. The most important part of his community life was the Los Angeles Lodge of the Chinese American Citizens Alliance. He was elected President of the L.A. lodge in 1967 and 1968. His other community involvements included being Fire Marshal for Chinatown. He was a charter member and Life member of the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California. He was very much for education, especially of the youth, realizing that much of that opportunity was deprived him in his earlier day. His sharp memory combined with and honest interpretive view of things made him invaluable. And he was willing to share his knowledge with many students and scholars, patiently giving many interviews and discussions over the years. Not more than three months ago, George and wife Clara donated \$500 to support the C.A.C.A.'s National Centennial Youth Art Competition and Commemorative Calendar, in a fundraising effort by L.A. Lodge. George will be missed.

BUILDING COMMITTEE -- L.A. CHINATOWN HERITAGE & VISITORS CENTER

The CHSSC has successfully completed the first phase of the project. Phase 1 included raising funds for the down payment on the property for the Center, cleanup of the property which included new paint and landscaping, and holding monthly open houses with interim exhibits since June. We have held a number of special events at the property, such as two BBQ's, a holiday gift boutique, and a reception for the transfer of the Old Chinatown archeological collection.

The CHSSC Building Committee is now gearing up for the next, and very critical, phase of development. Phase 2 involves:

- reducing the seller-financed note on the property
- preparing detailed architectural and engineering plans
- building up a construction fund
- increasing our public relations effort

The public relations effort involves increasing the scope of activities on the site, such as new exhibits, more open house hours, docent training, and publication of a newsletter. Volunteers are needed and welcomed! There are interesting challenges, the projects are rewarding, and you meet a lot of new people. The Phase 2 effort obviously involves raising significant funds. Look for our new fundraising appeal in the mail, but CHSSC members are also invited to participate in the process.
