THE MAI WAH SOCIETY of BUTTE, MONTANA, one of 12 applicants in the country to receive grant funds from the Johana Favrot Fund for Historic Preservation, used the \$3,000 grant to retain a professional exhibit curator and designer to prepare plans of an interpretive exhibit using Asian artifacts found in the Wah Chiong Tai Co. and Mai Wah Noodle Parlor buildings. The Society also received a \$1500 grant from Seattle-based A Territory Resource to cover publication costs for a brochure on Chinese immigration to Southwest Montana. This grant along with a previous grant of \$1,000 from the ARCO Foundation resulted in a recently published 24-page The Butte Chinese, which is now available for \$3 a copy from The Mai Wah Society, 17 W. Mercury Street, Butte, MT 59701.

BURBANK HISTORICAL SOCIETY announces that Burbank City Hall has been placed on the National Register. On July 22, the City of Burbank received confirmation from the State Office of Historic Preservation in Sacramento that City Hall had met the criteria for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places.
