<u>DONATIONS TO THE WORLD WAR II PROJECT</u>- The Project recently received generous gifts from two veterans, Herbert Tom and Robert Woo, and the Dept. of Water & Power post of the American Legion, totalling \$650. Thank you for your generous and continued support. The latest report indicates that we have collected 150 discharge papers, used 14 rolls of film (350 + archived slide images) and have 125 electronically scanned head-shots for publication. Our Project goal is 200. There will be 4 more Registration Drives in Chinatown with two additional drives scheduled in Alhambra and Westminster. April 30 will be the last day for Collection of Veterans' data for Publication. The Society is planning a Book Reception in September. Date and place will be announced.
