FROM COLFAX TO PROMONTORY A Chinese American Heritage Tour, May 7-10, 1999

Slides and Recap by The Participants

Earlier this year, two dozen CHSSC members joined in a two day historical celebration hosted by the Colfax Area Historical Societies. Festivities included a guided tour along the American River canyon portion, in the Sierra Nevada, of the first transcontinental railroad in the U.S., and the dedication of a marker commemorating the carving of a roadbed by Chinese laborers in the 1860s on the side of Cape Horn, a sheer rock outcrop thousands of feet above the river. From Colfax, many members continued by Amtrak eastward to Promontory Summit, Utah, where we were joined by other CHSSC members to celebrate the 130th anniversary of the famous Golden Spike Ceremony of 1869. Planning and logistics for this great tour were handled principally by CHSSC members William and Natalina Chew.

Join us as we share with slides and personal accounts what we saw and learned about the role of Chinese workers in one of the greatest construction achievements in world history.

From GOLD MOUNTAIN to the NEW MILLENNIUM, the 6th Chinese-American Conference held at the University of San Diego from July 9-11, 1999 was a huge success. Over 20 CHSSC members and friends attended the conference. The conference was well

organized and well attended.

Job Description.

The Chinese Historical Society of Southern California (CHSSC) seeks a motivated individual to provide part time office and project assistance. Candidate shall support the daily operations of the programs of the Society under the supervision of the president or his/her designee. Duties shall include most aspects of clerical office operations. Candidate may schedule, coordinate and conduct walking tours. Candidate may also assist in the operation of the Society's Visitor Center and in its fundraising administration. There may be some coordination of volunteers and interns. Initially, work days shall be Thursday through Saturday, for a total of 12-18 hours per week.

Qualifications.

High school graduate. Minimum of a two years' college or the equivalent in one or more of the following disciplines required: humanities, social sciences, business administration, or related subjects, is highly preferred. Good writing and very strong oral communications skills shall be required, with bilingual language skills (Cantonese or Mandarin) desirable. Familiarity with office computer tools, software and other office machines must be demonstrated. Candidate must show interests compatible with the goals of the Society. Very good interpersonal, team building, and organizing skills are a plus.

Employment Conditions: Range of \$8-12 per hour. No benefits except 3 paid national holidays. Parking and other work expenses paid. Job may grow to full time.
