STRANGERS FROM A NORTHERN SHORE:

An Architectural and Historical Exploration of Vancouver's Chinese Community

Andrew Yan

Vancouver, Canada is one of the last remaining significantly-sized historic Chinatowns in North America. This talk will be an architectural exploration of Vancouver's Chinatown and how it is associated with the changing demographics of the city's Chinese Canadian community. Interestingly, just as the Chinese represent 28 percent of Vancouver's population, Chinatown is currently in significant economic trouble. This is a problem that seems to be facing Chinatowns throughout the West Coast of North America. Consequently, this talk will also be on the future of Chinatowns in the brave new world of overseas Chinese migration and money.

Andrew Yan is a Master's student at UCLA's Urban Planning program. He is currently researching a thesis on revitalization strategies in the Chinatowns of Vancouver and Los Angeles. He holds an honours degree in Geography and Political Science from Simon Fraser University, and when not researching, he is in search of the ultimate beef brisket on rice in Los Angeles.

ANOTHER PROJECT SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED. The Chinese Historical Society of Southern California (CHSSC), in conjunction with the Information Services Division (ISD) of the University of Southern California, and with funding from the John Randolph Haynes and Dora Haynes Foundation, is pleased to announce the launch of its new web accessible database, the Integrated Digital Archive (IDA) – Chinese Historical Society of Southern California. The project represents the results of an effort on the part of CHSSC to place its significant artifact collections into the public domain, to stimulate academic and public interest in the objects. The artifacts document the lives of Chinese people living in Los Angeles from about 1885 – 1935. Some were excavated from deposits earlier covered over during the construction of Union Station in the 1930s, prior to the recent construction on the MTA Red Line. Some were excavated from the site of an old Adobe near Santa Barbara which once served as the location of a Chinese laundry.

While the artifacts themselves remain in curatorial storage, it is hoped the present project will help to bring the collections to the attention of interested scholars and community groups for whom more in-depth analysis would be useful.

USC's ISD was instrumental in assisting CHSSC by providing server space for the storage of more than 1,100 digitized images of artifacts from the collections, and providing access to the images through an up-to-date search engine. The CHSSC webpage takes its place among the other databases in ISD's Integrated Digital Archives. IDA is being developed to create a "virtual library" of materials from various partnering collections to facilitate teaching and research related to the development of the Southern California metropolitan area.

(Professor Gene Cooper, CHSSC Board Member, was in charge of the project.)
