# Digging in the Delta

The historical archaeology of the Isleton Chinese American community

Presentation by Kelly Fong

This presentation will discuss Kelly Fong's ongoing doctoral research on the historical archaeology of the Chinese American community in Isleton, California. Isleton is one of the small rural towns in the Sacramento Delta that was, in its heyday, home to many Asian Americans who worked on the nearby farms, canneries, and local Chinese businesses. From an interdisciplinary perspective that draws upon Asian American Studies and historical archaeology, this project seeks to catch a glimpse into everyday life in Isleton between the late nineteenth century and the first half of the twentieth century by focusing on excavated material culture, documentary research, and oral histories. Her project focuses on the historic Bing Kong Tong building, which was home to the Bing Kung Tong as well as the Chinese language school in Isleton. This presentation will examine Fong's research and sketch out future directions for her work and Asian American historical archaeology more broadly.

# Cantonese Yankee



On March 7th Cantonese Yankee was presented by Louise Su Tang. Cantonese Yankee is the narrative of Kwong Bing Kong, or "Bing", a student sent by Imperial China to New England to study Western science and technology as part of the Chinese Educational Mission. One of 120 boys sent over between 1872-1881, the biography follows Bing and his years in America and his subsequent return to China as a modern mandarin. Louise Su Tang, Bing's granddaughter, was close to her grandfather during her childhood years in Shanghai. She has written an absorbing and romantic drama based on family stories and her own research at the Yale University Archives and the Connecticut Historical Society.


Evergreen Cemetery 204 N. Evergreen Avenue Los Angeles, CA 90033

Monument No. 486. It is owned and maintained by


