


Cantonese Yankee

Cantonese Yankee is the narrative of Kwong Bing Kong, or "Bing", a student sent by Imperial China to New England to study Western science and technology as part of the Chinese Educational Mission. One of 120 boys sent over between 1872-1881, the biography follows Bing and his years in America and his subsequent return to China as a modern mandarin.

Louise Su Tang, Bing's granddaughter, was close to her grandfather during her childhood years in Shanghai. She has written an absorbing and romantic drama based on family stories and her own hours of research at the Yale University Archives and the Connecticut Historical Society.

During the 19th Century, China faced a cabal of foreign powers ready to sweep the ancient empire from the pages of history. There have been books written about those days but few have plumbed the depths of her civilization—what were the customs, mores and ethos of her people? In *Cantonese Yankee* the author presents to her audience the intimate life of Bing and his family and the people of his day—and we are there with them.

113th Golden Dragon Parade 2012

Los Angeles' Largest Parade (Other than the Rose Parade)



On Saturday, January 28th, warm temperatures greeted the Chinese Lunar New Year of the Dragon. Over 110,000 individuals lining the parade route and many more viewing the telecast, this colorful celebration along Hill Street and Broadway in Chinatown has become the premiere cultural event in the Southern California Asian American Community. CHSSC held its usual position at the head of the parade with a sea of red, white and blue with over 260 participants including Society members, and support from Families with Children from China.

The CHSSC unit was greatly assisted by over 80 students from Bell High School's Interact Club, sponsored by Rotary International District 5280 and led by Dr. Joel Tepper. An additional 80 students from various South Bay high schools within District 5280, organized by Angi Ma Wong, plus a dozen students from the Youth Act Club from Roosevelt School (Lynwood, CA), led by teacher Fernando Millan, helped carry the massive display of flags.

CHSSC will host Ch'ing Ming (Chinese Memorial Day) Festival at the historic Los Angeles County Crematorium. The Chinese Memorial Shrine stands at the center of what was once a 19th century Chinese cemetery. Built in 1888 by the people of Los Angeles' Old Chinatown, the Shrine is considered the earliest extant Chinese structure in Los Angeles. Though few Chinese are still buried there, the site remains culturally and historically significant and has been designated Los Angeles Historic/Cultural Monument No. 486. It is owned and maintained by the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California. Please join us.
