

5th Annual Pilgrimage to Yosemite National Park

*Commemorating the
Contributions of Chinese
in the Sierra Nevada*

July 27th to August 2nd, 2017

The National Park Service celebrated its 100th Birthday last year. In its next 100 years, how will the Park Service interpret and educate visitors about the contributions of Chinese in building many of the roads and railways through the Sierra Nevada range, working at historic lodges and in the lumber industry, and contributing to the early history of our National Parks?

For the fifth year, the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California in collaboration with the National Park Service is helping to sponsor an annual pilgrimage to historically significant sites in Yosemite National Park. All Chinese Historical organizations are welcome as well as any individual to participate in this event. The dates and activities for this year are:

Thursday, July 27 - Limited Campsites Available

- Tent campsites at Wawona Campground available starting Thursday night to volunteers only.

Saturday, July 29 - Wawona Area History Talk and Pot Luck Cookout

Monday through Wednesday, July 31 to Aug. 2

- Pilgrimage to Sing Peak

- A three day backpacking trip which involves a day going off trail to climb to the top of Sing Peak (10,552' elevation), named after the famous chef of the Mather Mountain Party. Limited to those who are signed up on teams which have Wilderness Permits.

Save these dates and make reservations for accommodations in or around Wawona! Summer months are some of the busiest times in the Park and reservations are filled early. If attending the Friday event in Tuolumne Meadows, another option is to spend the first night, July 27th, at Mammoth Lakes, June Lake, or Lee Vining along the Hwy 395 corridor, and subsequent nights in Wawona.

In Memoriam

Jack Ong

The Chinese Historical Society of Southern California regrettably shares news of the passing of the great Jack Ong. Please join the CHSSC in celebrating Jack Ong's life in a public memorial service on Saturday, July 22, 2017 at 4:00pm, at: "The Collection, at Galpin Motor Sports", 15600 Roscoe Blvd., Van Nuys, CA 91406.

Many knew Jack Ong through his support of and involvement with the Chinese Historical Society of Southern California (CHSSC), especially as a former board member and the dinner galas he has emceed. Many of us knew him through his numerous acting roles on stage, TV and films over the decades.

Still, others knew and respected Jack as a genius writer, public relations and ad man whose professionalism, class and humor have helped bring success to the churches and organizations he served, as well as such powerhouse businesses like the International Hotel (later the Hilton) in Las Vegas, Galpin Motors, and Topanga Plaza in Los Angeles.

And many knew him as "Pastor Jack," leading churches and ministries and participating on missionary trips to foreign countries for a variety of human rights causes, including the Vincent Chin murder case (rallying support for Vincent's mother and calling for justice for his killers, appealing to Chinese in Hong Kong and Taiwan); and for his work as Executive Director of the Dr. Haing S. Ngor Foundation, which he founded with the Oscar-winning ("Killing Fields") actor. Jack's work in the realm of community service also included the Screen Actors Guild and American Federation of Television and Radio Artists – he helped establish and was the first chair of the Asian American subcommittee of the SAG board of directors, rallying for greater diversity in the media, on camera and behind the scenes. He was a longtime supporter of East West Players, having served on EWP's New Theatre Campaign; was always willing to "cheerlead" for the Chinese American Museum; and was an advisor to Born to Act Players (BTAP), a vital acting-as-therapy ministry for people with Down's Syndrome. BTAP was founded by Jack's close friend, actress Mary Rings.

Still others remember Jack as loving son, loyal brother, and doting uncle. You couldn't find a friend more sacrificing or supportive than Jack. His "life verse" from the Bible, "Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms" (1 Peter 4:10), truly reflects the man so many around the world were happy to know and call "friend".


CHSSC Receives Grant

CHSSC is pleased to announce that we have been awarded a grant from the California Humanities Quick Grant Program. The abstract for the project follows:

Island of the Blue Dolphins: The Lone Woman at the Crossroads

Island of the Blue Dolphins is a novel taught in nearly every elementary school in the country. This fictionalized account is based on the life of an American Indian girl who lived alone on San Nicolas Island, California, for 18 years, 1835-1853. Recent research reveals that this young woman witnessed commercial sea otter hunting, and likely Chinese abalone harvesting. These interactions highlight the multicultural contacts that took place on the west coast of North America. Two public talks will present cutting-edge research, and K-12 lesson plans will be created for the National Park Service's Island of the Blue Dolphins web-resource.

Linda Bentz, CHSSC Vice President, is the project director along with historian Susan Morris, and Robert Schwemmer the West Coast Regional Maritime Heritage Program Coordinator for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Office of National Marine Sanctuaries. Research conducted for this project will be presented at an upcoming CHSSC monthly meeting.
